This project was coordinated by Children Rights Alliance for England (CRAE) and was based on the definition of violence in Article 19 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child which guarantees every child the right to protection from physical or mental violence, injury or abuse, neglect or negligent treatment, maltreatment or exploitation, including sexual abuse. According to a recent Report published by Human Rights Watch (HRW) in November 2012, girls as young as 8 years of age have their rights violated being employed as domestic workers. Abolition of death penalty for juvenile offenders in Thailand

On 30th August 2012, the Thai government effectively abolished death penalty for persons under the age of 18. It further got closer to compliance with international human rights standards regarding juvenile justice by amending its Criminal Procedure Code and reducing life imprisonment for minors to 50 years.
