The IJJO joins international call to stop the execution of two Saudi youth

OIJJ

The IJJO has joined with five other human rights organisations to urge Saudi Arabia to cancel the executions of Ali Mohammed al-Nimr and Dawood Hussain al-Marhoon, imposed for crimes committed as juveniles. The joint statement that condemns this sentence is addressed to the Minister of Justice, Dr. Waleed Mohammad Al Samaani. It has been drafted by the Child Rights International Network (CRIN), and is signed by the IJJO alongside the European-Saudi Organisation for Human Rights, Defence for Children International (DCI), International Association of Youth and Family Judges and Magistrates (IAYFJM) and Terre des Hommes International Federation. Muhammad Imman Ali, Judge of the Supreme Court of Bangladesh



The Honourable Justice Muhammad Imman Ali was elevated as Judge of the Supreme Court of

Bangladesh, High Court Division in February 2001 and Appellate Division in February 2011. Previously, he had been Deputy Attorney General for Bangladesh from September 1998 to February 2001. His book, 'Towards a Justice Delivery System for Children in Bangladesh', was published by UNICEF in 2010. He has also written a chapter on the new Children Act 2013 in the book 'Justice for Children in Bangladesh' by Najrana Imaan, published by Save the Children. [\[+\]](#)
