The 56th session of the United Nations Committee on the Rights of the Child

The 56th session of the United Nations Committee on the Rights of the Child took place in Geneva, from 17 January until 4 February 2011. The Committee issued recommendations in the form of Concluding Observations to State parties following the presentation of periodic State party reports on the measures taken to implement the Convention on the Rights of the Child and its two Optional Protocols relating to the protection of children by the justice system, rehabilitation and social reintegration. The States examined were: Afghanistan, Belarus, Denmark, Lao People's Democratic Republic, New Zealand, Singapore Ukraine and Mexico. [\[+\]](#)

In accordance with the research done by Anton Van Kalmthout of the University of Tilburg (the Netherlands) about the application modalities of the pretrial detention measures and the bases for the Common European Regulations, emphasis is put on the fact that, in a lot of countries the pretrial detention of minors is done in worse conditions than that of adults.
