

UN General Assembly adopted the Arms Trade Treaty: a big step to full development of children

On the 2nd of April 2013, the Arms Trade Treaty that regulates the international trade of conventional weapons was finally ratified. Adoption of the Treaty makes it harder for the human rights abusers, criminal offenders and arms traffickers to obtain weapons. The UN General Assembly ratified the Arms Trade Treaty as a resolution by a 154-to-3 vote majority with 23 abstentions. [\[+\]](#)

62nd Session of the Committee on the Rights of the Child: Concluding Observations

OIJJ

The 62nd Session of the Committee on the Rights of the Child took place from 14 January to 1 February 2013 and examined the reports of eight states. Four of the states' reports (Guinea, Guyana, Malta and Niue) were submitted under Article 44 (1) of the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC); while the rest (USA, Slovakia, Philippines and Burkina Faso), under the two Optional Protocols to the Convention. Ms. Frances Cook, *Chief Executive of the Howard League for Penal Reform, United Kingdom.*



Ms. Cook introduces us in the penal English system where children are submitted to hard conditions in custody. She dismantles us a very authoritarian and punishable model that doesn't contemplate the psychological, social and educative children specific needs for that the disturbing self-injuring, death and recidivism data in custody reduce. She also advocates the reduction of the age in which it is criminally liable from 10 to 14 years old and remembers us that the Convention of the UN says that custody should only be used for the shortest possible time.
